David as he was affectionately called by his family, received his high school diploma from Baltimore City College. After graduating from City in 1973, David graduated from Baltimore City Community College with a degree in Business Management and Morgan State University with the degree in Business Administration.

David utilized his education while working in numerous business opportunities such as AFLAC, American General Life, Western-Southern Life as an Insurance Agent. He also worked as an Auto Salesman for a number of years for some of the major auto dealerships in Baltimore. His savvy business talent earned him many awards as salesperson of the month and year. The group won a trophy for 1st prize in a talent contest at Cherry Hill Recreation Center in 1968. The AGENTS hits were "Cloud 9, " "It's Your Thing," and "Check Yourself." They also wrote their own music. The group was acknowledge in the community paper.

David was an avid musician through the years, he played with numerous bands; Softones, BAD, Street Corner Symphony, First Class and Corner Pocket. David was well known for playing for in jazz Clubs such as City View, Jaspers, the Half Note and many other clubs in the Baltimore- Prince Georges County area. He also played for religious organization. The most recent was Reverend Lee Michael's Church Manifest Wonders Christian Center.

David lived teaching family members how to play the guitar. He also loved taking his family to New York to enjoy the diverse activities and to shop. David visited New York for many music venues including the David Letterman show to hear his friend Hiram Bullock play guitar with the show band. David had great concerns about Baltimore and Community issues; he attended meetings within his community and city hall to be better informed about neighborhood development and improvements. He worked with the Moulden Group, Inc. Attending community and government meetings concerning the redevelopment of a site in the Uplands Community in West Baltimore.

David loved music, karate, fishing, football and his adorable grandchildren. He loved his wife and 4 beautiful children sincerely in his own way.
