Out of this union of marriage four children were born: Duane, Lisa, Sheila and Todd. Barbara worked many years as an L.P.N. at several nursing homes and hospitals. After which, she took a job with Baltimore City as a School Crossing Guard. While working as a Crossing Guard, she held a part-time position with K-Mart Corporation as a door greeter. Through her dedication, motivation and work ethics, she was promoted to Security Manager. After years of serving in this position, she was promoted to Personnel Manager. After retiring from K-Mart, she returned to her first love which was the position of School Crossing Guard. She was well loved and admired by all the children, teachers and school principal. The children lovingly referred to her as "Miss Barbara". They felt comfortable in confiding in her about school, family and life in general. Even after the children graduated, they would always return to keep "Miss Barbara" up to date on what was going on in their lives. She would make an

extra effort to have school supplies, gloves, bandages, knit caps, hats, etc. available just in case one of the children needed something. Once she saw a child going to school in the winter time without a coat. She told the child that she had a coat at home that would fit her and all she needed to do was to get permission from her mother. Barbara loved looking out for the children at school and did not mind going the extra mile to assist them. She was a foster parent for many years and enjoyed traveling, dancing, shopping, music and family gatherings. She leaves behind to cherish and not to mourn: her husband for forty-six years, Arthur Burch Alexander; four children, Duane Alexander of Crestview, Florida, Lisa Diane Alexander of Baltimore, Maryland, Sheila Fields of Ft.
