Although an only child, she was reared in a household with cousins, Dorsey and May Ida whom she recognized as her sister and brother.

Barbara Ann was educated in both the private and public school sectors in Richmond, VA; however her love for knowledge did not stop after secondary schooling. She continued her education at Rutledge Community College, receiving a degree in Business and later went on to receive a Nursing degree from J. Sargeant Reynolds School of Nursing.

Barbara pursued her career in Nursing and was employed in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at MCV Hospital. She hung up her nursing hat in 1982 to pursue a career in Law Enforcement. She served 17 years as a Deputy Sheriff

In October of 1999, Barbara retired from her rigorous duties in Law Enforcement due to debilitating illness that left her unable to fulfill her commitment as a Deputy Sheriff. To remain active she opened several businesses including New York Nail Salon and Fashions and Designs Boutique. She also served as a Notary for the Commonwealth of Virginia from May 2001-2005.

Barbara was a former member of the Eastern Star Organization and served as Chief Council, Vice President and Supreme Recruit Deputy Council board member of the Lady Knights of Virginia.

Her accomplishments and achievements are great and certainly too many to name; however if asked, she would say her greatest achievement was being a mom and serving the Lord. Nothing was more important to Barbara than God and family. Her life has always been trusted in the Lord and she reared her children to have a personal relationship with God.

Her church home is Fountain Baptist Church, where she served as Pastor's Aide while also serving on the Usher's Ministry, Women's Ministry, Women's Choir and regularly attending Sunday School.
