Barbara Jean (Jeannie) Mackall, (nee Miller), formerly of Spotsylvania County, Virginia passed on Sunday, May 2, 2021, while at Med Star Southern Maryland Hospital Center in Clinton, MD. She was a resident of Future Care Pine View in Clinton, MD since October 2020. She was 77 years old.

Born in May 1943 and raised in Baltimore, MD, she attended Douglas High School, and completed two years of college credit at the Community College of Baltimore.
