Barbara Ann Pitts, age 79 of Richmond, Virginia, passed away on Friday, July 22, 2016. She was born to the late Harry Butler Sr. and Ruth Robinson Butler on April 22, 1937.

Barbara attended Buchanan Street Grammar School and Armstrong High School, before attending Harlem Hospital-School of Nursing in New York City where she was confirmed as a Registered Nurse. She began her career as a hospital nurse but shifted to Public Health Nursing with the New York City Department of Health for 38 years. During that time she obtained her Bachelors and Masters Degrees from Long Island University-Brooklyn Campus in Nursing and Public Health Administration. Barbara was a member of Chi Eta Phi Nursing Sorority.

Barbara retired from the New York City Department of Health in 1995 and returned to her beloved Richmond, Virginia. She was an active member in the Bethlehem Baptist Church and Armstrong High School –Class of 1955 Alumni Association. She served on various committees and wherever the need arose she was an activist for patient rights.

Family, friends, and travel were Barbara's passion and delight. She loved to host and entertain in her home. Barbara grew up spending summer vacations with her brother and cousins. These experiences never left her. She traveled

to Myrtle Beach where she would relax, eat, and listen to whistling of the waves against the rocks. Barbara enjoyed her time with her daughters and friends sunning in the Caribbean or taking in the sites in Washington, DC.

Barbara was a member of the Armstrong HS '55 Alumni Association. She loved her time and service with the Bethlehem Baptist Church Usher Board and Dance Ministry. She loved reading history, shopping, and eating her crabs.

Her brother Harry James Butler Jr. preceded her in death.
