Barbara received her diploma from Dunbar High School, Baltimore, Maryland, Class of 1961. She attended Cortez Peters' Business School where she received a Certificate of Completion. Barbara retired as a Supervisor in 1994 from Honeywell, formerly known as Bendix, contracted through NASA. While at Honeywell, she received several Certificates and additional training. After Barbara's retirement, she worked part-time for Baltimore County Public Schools, where she assisted the students in the school cafeteria.
