Because of her love of children, she became a Girl Scout Leader and sold plenty of cookies. Bea was a lover of people and with her love; she became a home health-care provider. Where you, aware that Mrs. Beatrice Boyd was one of the first employees of The Lady Bird Johnson's Head Start Program as well as a worker of the Title One Program?

Mother Bea loved to travel. She loved to visit New Jersey & New York. Aunt Bea just loved going from state to state seeing all that she could see. She loved to dance and listen to music in her earlier days, and her love of music

brought out a songstress in her. Mommie sang on the choirs in the churches that she was a member. Grandma's top 5 songs were: Yes, God is Real, Lily in the Valley, Jesus is The Sweetest Name I know, I Won't Complain, and it's Nobody's Fault but Mine.

The Bible was the favorite book to read. She loved the 23rd and the 53rd Psalms. The book of Ephesians was a book she also enjoyed, just to make it plain the whole New Testament was read over and over again. Mother Bea loved her Lord and Savior... Jesus is her best friend... if there was one thing that Aunt Bea, Mother Bra, Grandma, Sister Bea Mommie, or Bea would say to all of us is to find Jesus, because he made a difference in my life, and he can make a difference in yours. John 3:16 for God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.
