Beatrice Johnson was called to glory on Tuesday, February 3, 2004, after suffering heart failure at Mercy Medical Center. Beatrice was born on July 1, 1920 in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Charles and Mary Ann Bayonne. She was the fifth of six children. Beatrice received her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools. At an early age she became a member of Rehoboth Church of God in Christ (Apostolic) where she was baptized in the name of Jesus Christ and filled with His Holy Spirit. She served under the leadership of Bishop Randolph A. Carr and was the lead soloist on the church choir. She met and married Maurice A. Johnson Sr. She was the mother of six children. Maurice A. At a young age she worked for the Continental Can Company then later Edgewood Arsenal, which later became known as Aberdeen Proving Ground. In her later years she worked for the Rifkin Family.
