BEN WILLIAMS, son of the late Vincent Williams and Maggie Shears Williams, was born on March 31, 1929 in Greeleyville, South Carolina. He departed this life on Saturday, October 11, 2008. He received his education at Williamsburg County High School in Greeleyville. While in Greeleyville, he was a member of the Masonic Lodge. Ben joined the Army in 1950, and was awarded a Bronze Star for his bravery and dedication as a soldier during the Korean War. Other awards include Army Service Medal, Army Achievement Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Good Conduct Medals, and the United Nations Service Medal. After his tenure in the military, Ben moved to Maryland where he met and married Thelma Cooper, and out of their union he was blessed with three children, Mrs. Dorothy W. Allen (Reame), Mrs. T. Anne Bolton (Maurice) and Cynthia Williams; and four stepchildren, Modralyn Parker, Mildred Cager, Calvin M. Hammett (deceased) and Randolph Hammett. Ben worked as an engineer for the Freezer Construction Company constructing bridges and schools throughout the Tri-State Area. He worked on numerous sites which included the Baltimore Shipyard and various military installations. He retired in 1986. Ben met and married his second wife Gladys E. Shears (deceased), and out of that union he had two stepsons Kevin and Nathan Shears. Ben lived a humble life and became a born again Christian and a faithful member of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland. For the last twenty months of his life, Ben lived with his daughter Anne and family. He spent much of his free time with Maurice whom he thought of as

another son. He was a very energetic man who loved to communicate with people, and always found time to lend an ear to anyone who needed to talk. He will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew him.
