BERESFORD DUNCAN BRICE was born to the late Louise Brice Lane on September 29, 1918 in the country of Barbados, West Indies. Beresford better known as “Mike” or “Pop-Pop” was educated in the Barbados School System. He married his beloved wife of forty-three years, Iris Loleita in Barbados, West Indies in September of 1997. Beresford migrated to the United States in 1971, settling in Baltimore, Maryland. Mike began working at Sinai Hospital as an Intake Patient Assistant, where he retired after many years of service. He was a member of Arlington-Lewin United Methodist Church for over forty years.

Mike loved to watch the Oriole’s play and if it was not televised, he would sit on the porch and listen to the game on the radio. Whenever his children, grandchildren or fiends would come to the house, he would always be ready for “some dominos”. He could play dominos for hours and hours, and could “read” those dominos like a champion.

Pop-Pop was often referred to as a Drill Sargent. He would tell his kids and his adopted neighborhood kids what to do and how to do it. All the kids knew that whenever they came into his house, he was in charge and that they had to follow his rules. He was loved by all of them.

He loved and praised the Lord like no other, singing his Hymns and reading

his Bible so loudly he could be heard throughout the entire house.
