



Bernard Cash

August 29, 1947 - November 29, 2018

Elder Bernard Cash, the first of eight children, was born to the late John and Bernice Cash on August 29, 1947. Bernard received his early education in Baltimore City Public Schools and graduated from Baltimore City College. He later attended Morgan State College to study Business Administration.

Bernard was employed by Social Security Administration for 40 years. While there he was recognized for outstanding service and received numerous awards before retiring. During the weekends Bernard worked at the Upward Way Christian Bookstore assisting Reverend Burston for nearly 15 years.

Bernard's impeccable sense of style led him to become a personal stylist for many of his friends and numerous women in his church. His 'calling' to fashion led him to cities far and near diligently searching for that special item or unique brochque, bag, perfume for his customers. For Bernard, catering to his family and friends was an extension of his ministry. It was not uncommon for him to give a bag filled with beautiful pins, glasses or something he chose especially for you then walk away never asking for a dime. He was known for giving and sharing abundantly his love of fashion while also sharing the Word of God and offering encouragement to his customers.

As a young boy Bernard was abundantly influenced by the Apostolic doctrine. At an early age, Bernard attended services at First Apostolic Faith Church with his grandmother, Mother Bertha Farmer Emerson. God

fulfilled His Word to Mother Emerson ... “For the promise is unto you, and to your children and to all that are afar off” when Bernard was baptized in Jesus’ name and filled with the precious gift of the Holy Ghost. Bernard was overjoyed in receiving the Holy Ghost and was sensitive to God’s calling for him to study the Bible and learn more about His Word. Bernard was a consistent Sunday School student and was unashamed and seriously loved ministering to anyone he encountered everywhere he went.

Bernard answered the call to ministering the Gospel in 1988 through a prophetic vision while attending First Apostolic Faith Church. He was inspired to take Bible courses and successfully completed the course requirements and received a Certificate in Theology. As an ordained Elder he flourished in ministry as a Sunday School teacher, Bible scholar, prison minister and most recently a great help to his pastor, Apostle Cornelius Showell. Elder Bernard Cash was an avid student of the Word and received his Bachelor’s degree in Biblical Studies from the Elijah School of the Prophet Research Institute in Biblical Studies. For several years Elder Cash was one of the leading ministers at the Army of God Church in Christ, Inc. under the tutelage of Bishop Reese Powell where he also participated in outreach ministries such as The Prayer Warriors of Baltimore.

Elder Cash faithfully serviced First Apostolic in many capacities. He wholeheartedly believed in the Great Commission and ministered for 12 years at Jessup Prison for incarcerated women along with Sis. Wilhemina Joyner. As a result of Elder Cash’s heart for seeing the spiritual growth and maturity of the women in Jessup, many of them were released and continued living productive lives. There were some who answered the call to ministry and began preaching and evangelizing. Elder Cash also worked Sis. Mary Brown in the Hospitality Ministry and for 8 years with Elder Ethel Jacobs when she coordinated the Family and Friends Day at First Apostolic. Elder Cash was assigned to further the Family and Friends Day committee during the 2017 Centennial Celebration. During that year over 2,000 guests attended the

church each third Sunday and received gifts and a meal after each service. Elder Cash was always seen working for the Lord. For 12 years he taught mathematics and science courses with the Education Ministry of the church. He helped many youth and adults at First Apostolic obtain their General Education Diploma (GED). Elder Cash made time to do a Bible class at Social Security Administration. His love for the word of God compelled him to allow others to glean from his biblical knowledge when he taught Systematic Bible Courses in the Class Action Section of the Social Security Administration building in Woodlawn, Maryland. Elder Cash was also instrumental in leading the Leadenhall Baptist Church Wednesday Noon Day Praise and Prayer Service under the leadership of Deacon James Cherry. Many young aspiring ministers were delighted when Elder Cash invited them to speak at Leadenhall. His service for God led him to assist Pastor Doris Gray at the United Christ Church during their Bible classes too.

Elder Bernard's love not only for his natural family but also his First Apostolic family was palpable. Anyone who was around him knew of his great love for his families not only by his words but also by his constant giving to any and everyone who crossed his mind: going above and beyond in showing everyone how much he adored them.

Elder Bernard Cash leaves to cherish his memory, a loving host of brothers and sisters, Ola Davis, Rita Cash, Tyrone Cash, Vonzelle Cash, April Cash, and Rocco Cash; Uncles and Aunt, John Cole, Odis Cole and Bernice McIntosh; nieces and nephews, Kevin Davis, Dexter Davis, Wayne Cash, Darryl Buynum, Ayanna Swann-McClurkin, Mia Cash and Ashley Day; great nieces and nephews, Destiny Davis, Dexter Davis Jr., Aysia Davis, Bresean Davis, Tavon Nelson, Dakota Bunting, Kevin Richardson Jr., Michael-Jacob McClurkin, David McClurkin, Daniel McClurkin, Chelsea & Chase Buynum; one great great niece Damani Griffin; special God-daughter Dana Wilson; a special God-son Bobby Hudnall and devoted friends Phyllis Clanton and Pricilla Johnson.
