Bernard, affectionately known to friends and family as Bunny, received his early education at St. Peter Claver and went on to Carver High School. Bernard enlisted in the United States Army, where he served in the Korean War and was honorably discharged in 1961. Bernard worked for Baltimore Gas and Electric Company, and later as a professional driver for the Fuller Paint Company and Raimondi's Florist. After retiring, he worked part-time as a chauffeur. On June 2, 1954, Bernard married the former Jean Joan Washington. From this 20 year union, four boys and two girls were born. Bunny had a profound love of jazz music, drawing and western movies. He was known for his signature cowboy boots, cowboy hats and bolero tie. He shared his adoration for these things with his companion of many years, Wilsonia Russell, who preceded him in death in July 1999. Bernard was well liked and had many close friends at the Bernard E. Mason Building where he resided for over 15 years. He will always be remembered for his love of life by the manner in which he celebrated through his gift of decorating.
