Bernice became a young widow when a dump truck struck the automobile in which she and her husband had gone Christmas shopping, in 1951. Even though Bernice was in the accident she became able to walk, a year later. She was blessed to rear her family to become productive adults and parents. All enjoy God's abundant life. Blessed to be home with her children until the youngest one entered high school, Mrs. Young often found other children gathering at her home after school hours. Her positive influence of doing well in education, on the job and in relationships had influenced others in a variety of scenarios throughout many neighborhoods. Even during fifteen years of the Alzheimer's disease Bernice's demeanor was a Christian example of God's blessings.
