God had given her a gift working with the sick and the shut-in. Mother Bertha joined Apostolic Faith Church thirty years ago. She was so happy when she was accepted by the Missionary Board and was a "Mother of the Church." She was also a member of the Eastern Star. She had a great love of hats, and people couldn't wait to see the "Hat Lady" and the many different hats she wore. She was known for being a virtuous woman: very proud and sophisticated always with a smile. She enjoyed the trips Herbert took her on around the United States and Canada. In

2003, she became bed-ridden. During her illness, she was with her children. Herbert converted his car into an ambulance so he could transport her to visit family and friends. Pansel, knowing she loved flowers, was always renewing her flowers. She traveled life on a glory road. It began by signing her name on Apostolic Faith Church's roll; it shall end by hearing her name read out of the book of Life before God's great white throne. It began by taking the hand of a preacher; it shall end by having a hand once pierced by a nail take hold of hers. We thank God for the 98 years He gave her. She was the matriarch of six generations.
