Bertha Frazier Schools was an extraordinary woman. Born March 11, 1922, in King & Queen County-Walkerton, Virginia. She was the third child of twelve children born to the late George Robert and Bessie Frazier. On June 12, 2013 after an extended illness she went home to be with the Lord.

Bertha was educated in the public schools of King & Queen County, Virginia. At an early age she was baptized and became a member of New Mount Zion Baptist Church in Walkerton, Virginia.
