Bill Jones Jr. was born in Holden, West Virginia to the late Bill Jones Sr. and Ida Ashe. He passed on May 14, 2005 at Good Samaritan Hospital. He attended The New Second Missionary Baptist Church in Baltimore, Md. where Rev. Dr. Felton Williams Jr. is pastor. He received his early education in Holden, West Virginia. From there he served in the United States Army from 1943 to 1946. From the U.S. Army he received the WWII Victory Ribbon, American Theater Ribbon, EAME Theater Ribbon, two Bronze Service Stars and AP Theater Ribbon. He also served in the USAF from 1946 to 1948.
