BLANCHE SHERLEAN LANGLEY, daughter of the late Robert and Ludlow Butler, was born January 31, 1934, in Northumberland County, VA. She was the oldest of seven children. Sherlean departed this life on Tuesday, September 25, 2012.

She received her early education in Northumberland County, Public School. She later graduated from Douglass High School in Baltimore, MD. Sherlean took various courses at Community College of Baltimore, Morgan State University and Yale University. After raising her children, she became a substitute teacher in Baltimore City Public Schools, a caterer at The Sheraton, a drug counselor for the Maryland Department of Health, and a geriatric health assistant for several clients.

Her Christian life began when she accepted Christ as her Personal Savior, at an early age. As a young adult she studied God's Word and fellowshiped with others. She was a member and reared her children at Memorial Baptist Church for many years. Her current church membership was a Jerusalem Baptist Church where she was a faithful, devoted member until her health prevented her from attending church services.

Langley (Jimi) who preceded her in death, Joni C. Gummer, and Davol L. H. Langley.

Sherlean was a loving mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, niece, aunt and cousin. She loved to cook and entertain her family and friends, travel, frequent restaurants with her friends, and talk to friends and family on the telephone. Over the years Sherlean opened her home to many, for meals as well as short or extended stays. She was loved by many and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew her.
