BONNETT BAKER, daughter of the late Lula Perez and Antonio Bigzon, was born April 24, 1940 in Baltimore, Maryland. She departed this life on August 27, 2009 after a brief illness. She received her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools. After graduating from public school continue on in the field of Cosmetology where she excelled. She married George Harris Sr. and out this union four children were born. She was a Great Mother who lived Strong for her children and was an inspiration to her community. She was later recognized by The Afro-American Newspaper as the first certified African American Woman Cosmetologist to work for Oppenheim Beauty Salon, an all white salon in Mondawmin Mall during the '60s. Later from this marriage, Harris Grocery was born. She further expanded her entrepreneurial talents to several other successfully Black Owned and Operated Family Run Business in Baltimore for several years. After having a spiritual awakening, she joined New Psalmist Baptist Church where she was a devoted member and sang on the choir for more than seventeen years. She later remarried, the Mr. James Baker. After retiring form her business she served the elderly by opening Bonnett's Peaceful Homes, and assisted living home that served family and friends alike. She was "Quite The Lady," a tower of strength and beauty that left a most memorable impression on those who knew her. Bonnett had here brothers and one sister. Her brothers and sister preceded her in death: Lorenzo Raul Perez, Issac Perez, Enrique Perez and Sarah Sarie Wallace. She leaves to cherish her memory: her devoted husband, James

Baker; daughter, Benita (Tuttie); three sons, James, Rodney and George Harris Jr.; stepdaughters, Stephanie Baker; three daughters-in-law, Annette, Tira and Tammy Harris; a very dear and close friend, George Harris Sr.; sixteen grandchildren, fourteen great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
