After the completion of his military service, He pursued higher education. He attended Morgan State University, and later Coppin State University where he received his Bachelor of Science in Education. He also received a Masters Degree in History, and a Doctoral Degree in Theology. B.L. was employed with the Maryland Transit System for 11 years. He then spent the next three decades as a n educator in the Baltimore City School System where he served as head of the History department. He was also and investment entrepreneur.

He accepted Christ in his later years, and became a devout Christian and also

a Minister. He often referred to himself as a “Teacher, Preacher and Soldier of The Cross”. He joined the Pikesville 7th Day Adventist Church on September 9th, 2008, and remained an active member until his passing. He admired his Pastor and enjoyed fellowship with the members of his church.

B.L. traveled the world and visited many places including Africa, Europe, Canada and Hawaii. He also took great pleasure in studying the Bible, spending time with family, and debating almost any subject with family and friends.
