BRYANT V. SMALL, Computer Engineer, departed this life on May 2, 2014 at his family home in Baltimore. Upon finishing his military service, Bryant enrolled at the University of Maryland (UMBC) and earned Bachelor of Science degrees in Mathematics and Computer Science. He subsequently went on to earn a Masters degree in Computer Engineering. In 1988, he married Carmellite Dianne Mitchell. Bryant worked for Defense Contractors where his skills in Computer Technology helped insure the safety of the United States of America. He could never tell us about projects he was designing, developing or implementing due to the top secret-clearances involved. But he loved his field of endeavor. Bryant also loved his family. He felt that family is the most important part of a person's life. It was all about family and being together. Bryant loved to tease other family members, while sharing quality time, and attending various social functions with them. Additionally, Bryant loved running in marathons, tinkering with cars, and water activities, specifically fishing on the Potomac River. Bryant is

survived by: his wife; two sons, Damien and Varell; sister, Renna; brother, Ralph Jr.; nephews, Alex and Brian; nieces, Autrese and Cari; two grandchildren; an uncle, W.C. Taylor; and a host of cousins and friends.
