Calvin Coolidge Watkins, Sr., son of the late John and Lovey Watkins, was born on August 28, 1926, in Baltimore, Md. He departed this life in his home on November 9, 2001 after a lengthy illness. Calvin, or “Sport” as he was so well known, served in World War II under the U.S. Navy and often told stories about his experiences and travels around the world.
