



Pastor Carl Pagan

December 18, 1937 - August 17, 2020

Carl Edward Pagan was born on December 18, 1937, the second son of Harry and Beatrice Dandridge, in Martinsville, Virginia. Both later found happiness in other unions and Carl was raised by Eura and Beatrice Pagan.

Carl attended Baltimore City schools and, after a stint in the U.S. Army, graduated from the Baltimore College of Commerce in 1967 with a degree in accounting.

He was a hard worker with an abundance of energy and a friendly, entrepreneurial spirit. A laundromat was one his first businesses along with a firm offering accounting and consulting services. He also enjoyed working with his hands, and used them to renovate and restore old houses, amassing the tools and skills to do repairs on all of his properties.

In 1973 he married Margaret Haley, and their daughter, Carla, was born, becoming the younger sister of Margaret's son, Duane. Carl liked to relax outdoors. After purchasing a recreational vehicle, the family traveled and camped every summer from Canada to Florida, and many States in-between.

Carl gave his life to Christ in 1980. One particular trip took the family to a Christian campground, Sandy Cove in Northeast, Maryland where they vacationed every year afterward. While there, Carl received a call to ministry.

To serve people and lead them to Christ, he taught at Baltimore School of the Bible. Wanting to do more he sold many of his business interests and entered Capital Bible Seminary in Lanham, Maryland, receiving a Master of Divinity degree in 1989. In 1990 founded Urban Bible Fellowship Church in an East Baltimore neighborhood adjacent to public housing. Many neighborhood children were ministered to in his church.

In 2006 Carl was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease and, over time, developed complications that led to his death. He leaves to cherish his memory his loving wife, Margaret; daughter, Carla; daughter-in-law, Rachel Haley; grandchildren, Elijah Pagan, Joseph and Emma Haley; brother, Glen; two sisters-in-law; a faithful congregation; and a host of other relatives and friends

“ To the Pagan family: I have known Carl since being a member at Manna Bible Baptist Church starting around 1976. He mentored me through various life challenges. Carl was a low-key person at church so I really did not know what he did for a living. During my lunch break from the former Maryland General Hospital, I chose to take a walk in the neighborhood. While walking I found Carl on his knees working on a home. I learned that one of his jobs was buying, remodeling and selling homes. I later learned he had property in Baltimore and Washington DC. Being a landlord, he had to be creative when trying to rent a property to the majority culture. He would present himself as the janitor, show the property and then mail the contract to the tenants. He would have me drive around with him in his small Toyota pickup truck. Later I learned he also own a Laundromat. During this time together he would mentor me. Once we met after I was “let go” from my management position at the former Maryland General Hospital. He gave me good advice, just move on and don’t think about any legal redress. I took his advice and quickly found another job. Our family moved to Syracuse New York so I could accept a corporate sales position. I was in Syracuse New York and my wife was left to sell our home in Baltimore. As usual, there is a last-minute challenge when selling a home. The home inspector wanted a small area of the outside painted. I was in Syracuse and did not know what to do. I called Carl and he said he would take care of it. The house sold and the family was able to move to Syracuse New, York. He had a heart for Pastoring and as a result started a church in an old Catholic building that needed many repairs. He worked tirelessly on that building. When I visited, he was so proud as he took me on a tour of the facility. He had a big vision for the church and the community. He and his wife, gave their time and money to the community and the church grew. We both got involved with a men’s bible study called Business Men’s Committee now called Christian Business Men’s Connect. Their goal was to point businessmen to Christ. Baltimore has lost a great Pastor and servant.
