CAROLINE GURTRUDE COLMAN, was born on January 13, 1916 in Manila, Philippine Islands. Caroline was the eighth child of the eighteen children from the union of the late George Leonard and Ramona Pascual Sewell. She was a very young child when the Sewell family arrived in the United States they faced many challenges, however their faith prevailed.

Caroline was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. Caroline helped her mother care for her younger siblings after her father's death. She was very devoted to her family.

In 1939, Caroline was united in Holy Matrimony to her late husband, Jefferson Coleman. During the war she worked in the Civil Service District serving others. Once the war was over, Caroline worked for Hutzler's Colonial Restaurant for twenty-five years. She resigned from Hutzler's to care for her mother, until the Lord called her home.

Caroline was baptized at the First Apostolic Faith Church in 1949. She received the gift of the Holy Ghost in 1950. Caroline enjoyed singing praises to God. She was a member of the Gospel Choir, the Sanctuary Choir and the Women's Choir, which she participated in for over fifty-three years.

Caroline also joined the Social Missionaries under the leadership of the late

Bishop Winfield Showell and Mother Mildred Bowen (President) in the 1940's. Caroline became very close friends with Bowen family. She often talked about how she loved visiting other churches with the missionaries. Caroline was always willing to serve others.

Caroline and her late husband were happily married for forty-six years, until his death in 1985. They never had children, however she had several godchildren. Caroline was loved by her many nieces and nephew.

Carolina was the last surviving child of all of her siblings. She was a loving and caring person. Everyone loved her. She was known as "Aunt Caroline" to everyone that she met. Her loving and caring ways will truly be missed. She is survived by two sister-in-law, Ethelin and Mary Swell; and a host of nieces and nephews.
