CARRIE ELIZABETH HANSLEY, was born to Nathaniel and Rebecca Hansley on September 18, 1913 in Wilmington, North Carolina. She was the fourth oldest of eleven siblings. Carrie was affectionately called “Toosie” by her father.

Carrie was educated in Wilmington N.C. Public School System. She joined the United States House of Prayer for All People in 1940 shortly thereafter. In her early years, she was a faithful worker on the Queens Auxiliary and loved attending convocation. Carrie and her sisters were very close and were always there for each other, even when she moved to New York for a short time and then moved to Baltimore in 1958 where she remained. Carrie was a very independent woman and a meticulous bookkeeper who made sure all of her business affairs were in order. She was also an excellent seamstress and could make anything.

Although Carrie had no children of her own, she loved and compassionately cared for children and became a wonderful “Mother” to many children, both inside and outside of the family. She soon became known as “Too Too.” Carrie always had great patience with children and decided to become a Licensed Daycare Provider for the Baltimore City Department of Social Service in 1977, taking care of many children for over twenty years. She also helped raise her nieces and nephews, loving every minute of it. Carrie is known for singing the

“La-Dee-Da-Dee” song to all of her children. She taught her children love for one another, self-respect and respect for others and always to be kind and loving to each other, helping someone along the way. Every day, you could hear her say and sing “You are my sunshine.”

Carrie “Toosie” loved the Lord with every fiber of her being and always gave God the glory throughout her life. She taught us the “Prayer of Faith” that her mother taught her.
