Carrie Mae English-Curry was the eldest of five children born on August 3, 1945 to Julia Mae English and the late Charles Hughes English. Carrie was baptized and confirmed at an early age at the Historic St. Francis Xavier Roman Catholic Church where she began her personal journey with Christ. She remained faithful to her belief in God's goodness, grace and power, until he called her home. Carrie received her primary education from St. Francis Xavier Parochial School and she graduated from Dunbar Senior High School in 1962. After graduating from high school, Carrie worked for a period of time at Johns Hopkins Hospital as a nurse's aid. In 1963 Carrie married her high school sweetheart, James Curry (who preceded her in death), a Master Tech Sergeant in the United State Air Force, and from this union three children were born Antonio, Darrell and Martin. They were married for 41 years. After raising her children and being a stay at home mom for several years, Carrie decided she wanted to attend college and obtain a degree in sociology. With the help and support of her husband, she attended and graduated from Sojourner Douglass College with a degree in sociology. Carrie best known as "Little Bit" had a kind and generous heart. She did everything in life her way and no other way. She enjoyed a good argument and would always have the last word, no matter what. Carrie loved her family and never missed an opportunity to brag about them. She leaves to cherish her memory, two children, Darrell Curry and
