



## Caruso Jean Phair

May 23, 1942 - May 13, 2009

Caruso Jean Phair, beloved son of the late Eugene Sr. and Floretha Celeste (Turner) Phair, was born on May 23, 1942, in Fayetteville, North Carolina. After a brief illness, he departed this life on May 13, 2009, at the age of sixty-six. Caruso was quiet and introspective, rarely initiating conversation unless he knew you or it was necessary. But he could become quite animated if the matter discussed were of interest to him. He also had a great sense of humor and wonderful laugh. As a young teen, Caruso was an outstanding athlete; despite his size, others marveled at his agility and his talent at playing baseball and football. Caruso received his education in the Baltimore City Public School system. He graduated from Carver Vocational Technical High School where he majored in Radio, Television and Electronics. He was also enrolled in Carver's technical course where he excelled. While in High school, Caruso enjoyed finding old radios and televisions and rebuilding them. After high school, Caruso enlisted in the Air Force where he was honorably discharged after serving four years as a photo electronic repairman. He subsequently attended RETS Trade School for additional training in electronics. Caruso worked at a number of companies before he obtained a position with Western Electric. While at Western Electric, he received several awards for outstanding performance and perfect attendance. Because of Caruso's dedication to his mother his siblings, he retired from Western Electric rather than relocating with the Company. At an early age, Caruso joined Whitestone Baptist Church. However, his commitment to and participation in

the church increased substantially after his retirement. At that time, he joined the First Mount Calvary Baptist Church and became a devoted member of the Mass Choir and worked tirelessly in the Church's soup kitchen. It was not unusual for Caruso to remain until all dishes were cleaned and the kitchen was in order-such was his devotion to this work. Caruso leaves to cherish his memory: six brothers, Eugene Jr., (Diane), Norman, Roger (Melissa), Larry (Marian), Steve (Faye), and Paul (Karen); three sisters, Vernell McLaren, Lora Whitehead (Courtney) and Phillipa Taylor along with a host of other relatives.
