At home they spent their time watching the Discovery channel, old westerns and comedies. He loved to laugh and you could hear him roaring with laughter whenever he watched his comedies. To all who knew him, as “Mr. T” or “Uncle Tom: or Uncle Carvel, he will surely be missed. He lived a full life with no regrets and was satisfied that his earthly goals had been accomplished. He embraced death with the same deliberation and sense of purpose that carried him through his life. In his last days, his faith, his growing trust in God, and his belief in the Word provided him comfort and assurance that he would soon be with Jesus.
