Carver Clayton, son of the late Joseph and Ella Clayton was born in Oakland California on February 8, 1928. God called him home on December 9, 2004 after a lengthy illness. His only brother Joseph Clayton, Jr. and his youngest sister Bessie Patterson preceded him in death. Carver attended the Oakland California Public School System. He entered the Coast Guard as a merchant seaman on December 7, 1941 where he received his G.E.D. He received an honorable discharge from the Coast Guard on December 31, 1946. After enjoying time with his family he was inducted into the U.S. Army on February 21, 1951. He transferred to the U.S. Army Reserves on July 14, 1953 where he received an honorable discharge on January 23, 1957. In 1957 he returned to the U.S. Coast Guard as a merchant marine where he served until 1975. He retired from Coldspring Newtown Condominium in 1994. On May 9, 1954 Carver was joined in holy matrimony to Millicent Damons and from this union one child was born. Carver was cherished as a gem by his family and friends. He enjoyed listening to jazz and spending time with his family. He always encouraged others to become financially savvy and to be well educated. He leaves to cherish in his memory a loving and devoted wife of 50 years Millicent Clayton. One daughter Cecily Clayton, seven grandchildren; Teresa, Marty, Thomas, Christine, Zack, Monique, Fernando and one grandson-in-law; four great-grandchildren; two sisters, Earlamae Thomas and Eloise Clayton-Gilmore; nieces, nephews and a host other relatives and friends.
