



## Catherine Kinney

September 2, 1932 - May 27, 2006

CATHERINE KINNEY, retired Registered Nurse, died suddenly Saturday, May 27, 2006. Catherine was born in North Carolina and raised in Portsmouth, Virginia, where she graduated from Our Lady of Victory Catholic High School. She earned her Bachelor's Degree in Nursing from the Catholic University of America in 1953. Catherine was the only child of Mary Lyles and Edward Wilson. She married Luther R. Kinney, Jr. in 1954 and resided in the Govans and Original Northwood communities of Baltimore City until recently, when she moved in with her daughter and son-in-law in Owings Mills. Catherine spent most of her professional career working for Baltimore City Health Department, taking time off to raise her family. She retired in 1993. Catherine enjoyed travel and frequently took cruises; each year she looked forward to planning for next year's getaway. In addition she took periodic day trips to Atlantic City and Dover Downs. Catherine had a close-knit circle of friends with whom she socialized. Despite a serious automobile accident in December 2005 and subsequent surgeries, she was on the road to recovery and was planning future pleasure trips with her friends. Catherine was baptized into the Catholic Church and was a dedicated believer in Christ her entire life. She was a long time parishioner of Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church in Govans, where she was quite involved in volunteering for church activities. Though she had recently begun attending Holy Family Catholic Church in Randallstown, she frequently returned to Blessed Sacrament where she enjoyed serving the Lord with her long time friends and fellow parishioners. A son, Paul A. Kinney, and

her husband preceded Catherine in death in 1980 and 1992, respectively. Catherine is survived by two sons, Vincent M. and Steven C. Kinney, and a daughter, Dr. Judith M. Kinney all of Baltimore. Also surviving are daughter-in-law, Jamie L. Kinney; son-in-law, Calvin E. Gladden, II; five grandchildren, Marcus, Jordan, Noelle, Aleesha and Kyle; and a host of family and friends.
