Catherine Elizabeth Lowery, daughter of the late Alifonia Jenkins and Annie M. Epps, was born on March 27, 1954 in Baltimore, Maryland. She later moved to Sumter, South Carolina and was led into adulthood by the late Sara Lemmon.

She began her education in the Baltimore City Public School System, but completed her studies in the Sumter County School System in South Carolina. He was a graduate of Mayewood High School Class of 1972. She worked for many years at Bosch Industries, Sumter, South Carolina until her retirement.

Catherine Lowery joined the Asbury United Methodist Church, Lynchburg, South Carolina in 1966 and received her baptism there. While a member of Asbury UMC, she spread her talents and served on many committees, organizations and groups: Adult Choir, Charge Choir, Usher Board, Kitchen Committee and the United Methodist Women of Asbury. She was the first chairperson of the Financial Committee and was the first to start an official Friends and Family Day. She was a faithful member until her illness and relocated to Baltimore, Maryland.
