Deacon Jackson heard so many great things about the church his daughters attended in Richmond,VA., that he wanted to experience it for himself. He visited Redeemed Assembly of Jesus Christ,in 1995 and never looked back. At Redeemed Assembly under the leadership of Dr. James F. Harris,he served as a Deacon and a member of the finance team until his health failed. His favorite scripture was Romans 12:18"If it be possible,as much as lieth in you,live peaceably with all men" and Romans 4:6a "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge." Deacon Jackson prayed constantly for his family and always told them to do the right thing and to treat people like you want to be treated.
