Charles Alexander departed this life on October 3, 2009 at the Baltimore Veterans Hospice Facility. Chuck, as he was known to his friends, was born in Lunenburg County, Virginia on April 11, 1927 to Elliot P. Alexander and Lula Cheatham Alexander who preceded him in death. He lived most of his life in Baltimore. Charles served his country proudly and courageously as a veteran of World War II, enlisting before legitimate eligibility. He served in the U. S. Army as a TEC5 and was honorably discharged. He later retired from Bethlehem Steel. In addition to his parents, Charles was preceded in death by a brother, George, who died in infancy, a twin brother Aaron, who died at age 11, stepfather, Willie Jones, of Baltimore; aunt, Mamie Cheatham Wright; and uncles, James Cheatham, Worth Cheatham and Bernard Cheatham. He is survived by his longtime companion, Bernice Ford; his sister, Evelyn A. Tolland of Washington, DC; the mother of his children, Mary D. Alexander of Reidsville, NC, his daughters, Cassandra A.
