“ Condolences to Family, friends and co-workers.

*For Charles Alexander*

*I came to Electric Test Department of BGE in 1977 after several years in Electric Construction. I met Charles Alexander in the transformer test shop when he handed me two "play books" that were our test procedures for all substation equipment.*

*We all called him Alex.*

*Alex was one of a handful of men trusted to do complex test procedures. He showed me how to do core & copper loss and build uptests on new transformers using the 13,000 volt test bench. Then came ML32 Step Voltage Regulators and Reclosers. I was in awe! There was nobody looking over his shoulder to make sure his calculations were correct. They trusted his knowledge.*

*Alex left the transformer shop and went to the Field Group of Electric Test for a promotion/ better pay/ greater opportunities. About five years later I joined him in the field group. After some basic training Alex asked me if I wanted to go to Calvert Cliffs Nuclear plant for 3 or 4 days. There we were, two black men, working on 500,000 volt equipment with nobody looking over our shoulder. We got looks and questions and even confrontation, but Alex swatted them away like flies. I was in awe.*

*They called down and gave us more work, so we stayed for a week, living in a hotel. We had to do Incipient Gas samples on the main transformers. That required us to go into the Control Room of this Nuclear Power plant to take load readings.*

*Years later they put me in charge of jobs at Calvert Cliffs. I was comfortable. I was trained by somebody who put me on his shoulders and showed me the way.*

*Alex was also the single point of contact for maintenance and emergency work at NSA. That meant on call 24/7. When he decided to retire he named me as his successor. Big responsibility and an eye opening experience, but once again I was well prepared by Charles Alexander.*
