



## Charles Leo Brown Sr.

January 29, 1931 - May 16, 2018

Charles Leo Brown Sr., age 87, passed away peacefully early Wednesday, 16 May 2018, at Season Hospice at Sinai Hospital. He was born on 29 January 1931, in Baltimore, Maryland to Charles P. Brown and Violetta Ernestine Reed.

Leo, as he was affectionately known, graduated from Booker T. Washington Junior High School and Frederick Douglas High School, in February 51 Class. He was voted one of the best athletes in his class.

He met Patricia V. McDaniels while in high school. They were married on June 4th, 1954, after Patty graduated.

Immediately after graduating from high school, he worked for the United States Postal Service. In December 1951, he joined the United States Air Force. He was stationed at Lincoln Air Force Base, in Omaha, Nebraska and was joined by his wife and son Charles L. Brown, Jr. He was then deployed to Alaska and his family moved back to Baltimore.

Separating from the Air Force with an Honorable Discharge, he returned to Baltimore, where he bought a home on Spruce Drive; Returning to work at the Postal Service, where he worked 50 years as a mail-handler at the main post office. During his free time, he received certificates for Automobile Mechanics

and Automatic Transmissions.

Neighbors on Spruce Drive would say they could set their clocks by Leo because at 2:00 pm, he was on his way to work.

He enjoyed football, ice skating, drawing and music. While stationed in Alaska he was in a singing group. Where the group recorded the neighborhood famous song "Do Why!" He loved music and loved to write songs.

He was a home team man; he loved the Baltimore Colts until they left and loved the Ravens and the Orioles.

He was preceded in death by Patricia on September 28, 2002, after 48 years of marriage. He leaves to cherish his memory: son Charles L. Brown, Jr. (Aslena), son Kevin George Brown, and daughter Ellen Patricia Brown; sisters-in-law Dorothy Dean and Kathleen Wilson; brother-in-law Charles Anfield (Helen); and host of nieces, nephews, family and friends.
