CHARLES ROLAND BROWN, son of the late Wesley and Mary Brown was born on March 10, 1922, Maryland. Charles, the youngest of eleven children departed this life on Tuesday, December 28, 2010 after a lengthy illness at Long Green Genesis Nursing Facility.

Charles was a graduated of Paul Laurence Dunbar High School Class of 1940. After leaving high school Charles was drafted into the United States Army Air Force Division. He was part of the 1898th engineer Aviation Battalion. He was afforded an opportunity to further his education. He was taught drafting and engineering and received numerous medals and citations. Charles loved photography and painting. He did his hobbies so well that he was chosen to take picture of the various areas he was deployed to while in the military. He separated from the military on November 5, 1945. After returning home from WWII, Charles opened a photo studio on Gay Street. His arts earned him an exhibition at the Smithsonian Museum and the Walters Art Gallery and numerous other showings.

On April 8, 1960 he was united in holy matrimony to Helen Williams. She shared his love for travel and family. Charles and Helen traveled this great country seeing and photographing some of the greatest places in the United States. They traveled to all but three states in the United States. The love of his life preceded him in death on September 13, 2003.

Dad, Granddad, as he was affectionately called by his family, loved to travel. So every summer he would arrange affordable vacations so the family could join in and see the many beautiful sights.

Dad was a steelworker. In 1950 he was employed by Armco Steel Company. He was a foreman and union representative for the workers at Armco Steel. After many years of labor for Armco and its' workers, Granddad retired in 1984. Just as with the workers at Armco, Granddad was always trying to keep family together and interest in some project of cause.
