



## Charles L. Savage Jr.

January 22, 1951 - June 10, 2019

CHARLES LEE SAVAGE, affectionately known as Charlie was born on January 22nd 1951 in Baltimore City to the late Berdella Wilson and Charles Savage, Sr. He departed this life on June 10th 2019 after his condition worsened. He was preceded in death by one brother, Robert Savage, and two sisters Christella Savage and Berdela Gladden, and a son Trevis Campbell, and his stepfather, David Wilson.

Charlie was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System. He graduated from Mergenthaler Vocational-Technical High School in 1969, with a concentration in printing. After graduating from high school, Charlie worked briefly in the Printing Industry. Most recently, Charlie worked in maintenance at the Fifth Regiment Armory, where he endeared himself to his coworkers.

He served in the United States Army from May 19th 1970 to January 19th 1972. He received an Honorable Discharge from the Army.

When Charlie was younger he was a very good athlete. Playing the position of catcher, he led his little league baseball team to a championship. Charlie was also a flashy dresser. He loved nice clothes and would often be seen in a fur coat or long length leather coat. He always wore dress shoes, and did not own a pair of tennis shoes. Charlie loved being around pretty women, and loved making them feel beautiful. Charlie was a very sociable man. His swagger and

coolness set him apart from all others. Charlie was known for his outlandish sayings, like when he told us the only time he drank alcohol was when he was with family members. I don't think anybody believed him. Charlie loved spending time with his family and friends. He especially enjoyed getting together during the Holidays. He would start early in the morning, calling family members to find out where the festivities would occur. Anywhere Charlie went in Baltimore City he would see somebody that he knew, because he was a memorable character. One of his passions was going to the beach. He loved being near the water.

He leaves to cherish his memory: his father Charles Lee Savage Sr., one son, Christopher Campbell; two brothers, Marcus and Louis Savage, two sisters, Denise M.
