



## Charles Bruce Scott Sr.

April 6, 1959 - May 19, 2018

Charles Bruce Scott, Sr. was born on Monday, April 6, 1959, at St Mary's Hospital in Brooklyn, New York. Charles was raised by his devoted parents, Ramona and William "Bill" Shaw, (birth father, Charles N. Scott). He was baptized when he was two-months-old at St. Clemons Pope Catholic Church. His first communion was at the age of six, and he was confirmed when he was 12 years old at St. Fortunata Church. Charles grew up in the church and was obedient in his faith.

Throughout his life, Charles was known affectionately by several nicknames. Friends and family called him; Scotty, Bruce, Charlie, and Brucereno. Along with being very strong and determined, he was an extraordinary and gifted athlete. During his youth, he was a member of the Boys and Girls Club of Brownsville, N.Y. where he learned and practiced baseball and flag football. Charles excelled in Little League Baseball and as an adult was drafted by Minor League Baseball. Scotty played football and baseball most of his life. Every fall and summer, he busily organized and played in local leagues.

Charles moved to Richmond, VA in 1974 with his family and became active in school athletics at Thomas Jefferson High School. He played both football and baseball in high school. Charles graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School in 1977. He not only excelled as a student athlete during high school but also, in college. Scotty will be remembered for his left-handed pitching

skills. He led his teams to many victories through his love of sports. He played “Rams” baseball at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) and majored in Business Administration and Management. At VCU, he was known as one of the top pitchers and outfielders for the college. Scotty received many athletic awards and honors.

Charles was trained in Culinary Arts and worked as Head Chef at local restaurants. Charles worked as a printer and pressman and was promoted to supervisor for Quebecor World for 29 years. Most recently, he honed his construction skills and accomplished lovely renovations for his customers. A licensed and skilled barber too, Charles blessed his community with creative hair-cutting.

On Saturday, January 12, 1985, Charles was joined in Holy Matrimony to his devoted wife, Jacqueline Y. Scott. They were the love of each other’s lives and demonstrated that unconditional love to their families. The Lord blessed them with three wonderful children, Charles Jr, Lauren, and Christopher Scott. Charles and Jackie joined St. Paul’s Baptist Church together where they raised their children to love the Lord. They were always focused on raising their children and coached their athletic abilities. Their family enjoyed traveling and entertaining family and friends. During his later years, Jackie and Lauren were by his side consistently. Steadfastly, they cared for him spiritually, emotionally, and physically.

Charles Bruce Scott, Sr. answered God’s call on Saturday, May 19, 2018, to come home and rest in the Lord. He was lifted and redeemed by the Power of the Holy Spirit. Much suffering and patience brings endurance.
