CHARLIE ROLAND FRIERSON, son of the late William and Ella Frierson, was born in Clarendon County, South Carolina on December 5, 1918. He was the sixth child of eight children. Six siblings preceded him in death. He departed this life on March 31, 2009 after a lengthy illness. He received his education in the public schools of Sumter and Lee Counties in South Carolina. In 1940 he joined and served in the United States Army. After completing his tour of duty, Charlie returned home and married Elizabeth Parrott who preceded him in death. Of this union they bore one daughter, Annie Mae. They later adopted a son Ulysses. Early in the marriage Charlie and his family moved to Washington, D. C. There he worked the Mayflower and the Smith Moving Companies. Several years later he and his family moved to Baltimore, Maryland. He was employed by the Southern Concrete Pipe Company. Charlie and Elizabeth loved children and opened their hearts and home to an extended family and fostered twenty-two children. Charlie devoted his life to Christ early on and later became affiliated with the New St. Mark Baptist Church. Charlie became a friend to anyone he met. He was very sociable and no one was ever a stranger. He spent many years after retirement at the K-Mart store on Wabash Avenue. K-Mart became his second home. He was there everyday and became an unofficial employee. He was a memorable character and will be missed. He was a devoted family man and was the unofficial family historian.
