March 5, 1964 - April 15, 2019

Charlton G. Wilder (Chuck), son of the late Calvin and Consuella Wilder, was born on March 5, 1964 in Baltimore, Maryland. He transitioned from this life on April 15, 2019.

Chuck received both his primary and secondary education in Baltimore at Mount Washington Country School for Boys and Gilman High School. Upon graduating from Gilman in 1982, he matriculated to Yale University, where he completed a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration. In 1986, Chuck advanced his education further studying at the University of Maryland in College Park obtaining two individual Master of Arts Degrees in Business Administration and Economics respectively in 1993.

Chuck worked as both an Actuary and Certified Financial Analyst (CFA) for various financial and investment institutions which included the Baltimore Life Insurance Company, Chase Bank and Fannie Mae Corporation.

A devoted and practicing Roman Catholic, Chuck attended mass on a regular basis. He was a former member of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church where in his youth, he made his first Holy Communion, which was followed by being confirmed along with serving as an Altar Boy. Later, he affiliated with All Saints Catholic Church with the discontinuation of Our Lady of Lourdes. While caregiving for his mother, Chuck also routinely attended mass at Saint Phillips

and James Catholic Church, the Cathedral of Saint Mary Our Queen and the Basilica of the Assumption. He was an active participant in many charitable activities and efforts which included clothing drives, feeding of the poor and in particular the distribution of food baskets for needy families at Christmas and other holiday times of significance.

Chuck was affiliated with and supported a variety of educational and professional organizations which included the Gilman High School Alumni Association, Yale University Alumnus, the National Society of Black Actuaries and the Association of Certified Financial Analyst (CFA). In addition, he was active in supporting the community through his high school affiliation at Gilman; where he taught and mentored students in the Upward Bound Program.

Chuck was an avid sports fan. From elementary through high school, he participated in basketball, soccer and ran various intermediate distance races as a member of the track team. He eventually transitioned into a long distance runner and often participated in various relay races in support of worthy charities in particular for Susan G. Komen.

He was a very devoted, reliable and faithful son, brother, uncle and friend who made many selfless sacrifices, often offering support to those in need.

Chuck leaves to mourn a brother, Calvin Wilder, Jr.; a sister, Stephanie Parker; a sister-in-law, Allison Wilder; two nephews, James and Peter; and a niece, Michelle; along with other loving and devoted family members and friends.
