Chauncey loved people, and although he sometimes had a "different" way of showing his affection, he would go out of his way to help anyone in need. Chauncey believed in telling his friends, family and colleagues the things he thought they needed to hear to succeed. He believed in education, was quick to question, and quicker to laugh.

He loved and cherished his family, and took care of us all until his last breath.
