He worked at McGuire Hospital and joined the United States Army in 1968-1977. In the U.S. Army he earned the rank of SP4, he was a Sharpshooter and a photographer, taking pictures of the war and Soldiers going to war. He was stationed in Vietnam, Germany and other countries, including the United States in Oakland, California. Chester volunteered later in his life at the Salvation Army on Grace Street, serving and feeding the hungry.
