CHRISTINE A. BROWN, daughter of the late George Johnson and the late Mary Frazier, was born on May 20, 1936 in Baltimore, Maryland. Shortly after being welcomed into the world, baby Christine's mother passed; her devoted and loving maternal grandparents, Rayfield and Martha Bush, raised Christine as their very own daughter. Little Christine proudly embraced family core values. She was affectionately known as “Tina”; as a youngster she was a natural born leader, twilight dreamer, inquisitive student and theatrical jokester. Once Tina became a teenager, she was a carbon copy of her mom “Martha”. Tina was hard working, independent, confident, energetic and very bright.

Tina attended Baltimore City Public Schools and St. Frances Academy, from which she graduated in 1953. This gave her a spark for knowledge, she received several awards and was an outstanding honor student; in addition she started to perfect her administrative skills, which many people admired up to this day.

Tina was united in holy matrimony in 1956 to Charles Philip Brown, Sr., “Charlie”, who preceded her in death.

Concurrently, Tina accepted numerous employment and/or assignments, in addition to aggressively pursuing her spiritual and educational growth. She

was a consistent hard worker and retired several times within her lifespan. Tina's first retirement was after 25 years with Fleishman's Vinegar, Baltimore, MD as a laboratory technician and the second was after 15 years with the Baltimore International College of Culinary Arts, Baltimore, MD as a librarian assistant. For the last 8 years she has worked for the Baltimore City Public Schools, as a teacher's assistant; her most recent assignment started in November 2013 at Harlem Park Elementary School, Baltimore, MD.

Tina was a faithful member of St. Ambrose Catholic Church of Baltimore, Maryland for over 40 years, and within that time frame received Christ as her Lord and personal Savior. At St. Ambrose she was a lecturer of the Living Word of God, a confirmation teacher and a member of the choir. Her service at St. Ambrose has touched generations of families.

Tina was a committed student of Baltimore City Community College (BCCC) starting in 2001 to the present, in which she received several awards and certificates. She challenged herself to obtain knowledge in computer skills, writing communication, and biblical studies.

She was determined to stay healthy and fit by walking several miles a week with other seniors in her building in addition to exercising at Curves, where she was an encouragement to others. Tina was a very peculiar and unique "social butterfly", who boldly loved God, her family and St. Ambrose Church. She also was an avid listener of Heaven 600 Morning Show with Elder Lee Michaels, to whom she was known as Trooper Brown. In addition, she loved and cheered on the the 2013 Superbowl Champions the Baltimore Ravens and President Barak Obama!!!

On Thursday, November 28, 2013, Thanksgiving Day, Christine A. Brown was selected to change her address to go home to be with her Heavenly Father.
