She enjoyed fixing and repairing household items; passionately prepared her special potato salad with shrimps and candied sweet potatoes. She loved to reminisce about the good "old days." Her favorite television shows were "Young and Restless" soap opera and Twenty-Four. An inspiration to all ages, many friends and neighbors thought of her as their sister or mother. As a child, Christine accepted Jesus Christ as her Savior and became a member of the Shiloh Baptist Church when located on Fremont Avenue and Lanvale Street. Later, she rededicated her life to Christ when Shiloh Baptist Church moved to Monroe Street. She faithfully attended Saturday School and enjoyed Bible study at home. Her spiritual growth in the Lord became stronger until she was called to her heavenly home. Christine leaves to cherish precious memories: daughter, Charlotte Steadman;

granddaughter, Sharmaine; devoted extended families Ewell's and Lee's and Vincent Oliver, a devoted friend of her granddaughter who has been a blessing to the family; and a host of other relatives and friends.
