Christopher Mark Ambrose was born on March 19, 1987, to Mark F. Ambrose Sr. and Tanya Ambrose at Sinai Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. He later attended New Christian Bible Church under the pastorship of Reverend Stephen Hardnett, eagerly playing the drums and singing in the Youth & Young Adult Choir.

Christopher attended both Baltimore City and Baltimore County public schools, where he played several sports, including Basketball. From ages of 12 to 14, he played for Chick Webb's Recreational League. While attending Milford Mill Academy, Christopher participated in Milford Mill's Marching Band, where he mastered the bass drum providing the soul and tempo for their many events and showcases.

Christopher developed many passions throughout his 31-years of life, but none matched his passion for music. After being introduced to music at an early age by his Father and Uncle Rickie, Christopher's love for jazz music quickly surpassed other genres with one of his favorite musicians being former NBA player, Wayman Tisdale. In addition to his love for music, Christopher was introduced to barbering at a young age and took pleasure in cutting family member's hair as he got older, with his first set of clippers being purchased by his Father, and especially cherished those moments when cutting his Grandfather's hair. During this same period, his God-given talent as a peacemaker inspired Christopher to join a team of protection and security professionals and he began enthusiastically providing security for local clubs and events in the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia area.

In 2007, Christopher was blessed with a beloved daughter, Kaliyah Ann Marie Ambrose, from a union with Karinn Lewis Blakey. From the beginning of her life to his last day, Christopher was a wonderful father. Of the many things he cherished, Kaliyah was the love of his life and he was dedicated to her totally.
