Later in life she became a social worker working with foster children. She did this up until her sickness. Mae was small in stature, but she was strong willed, independent, intelligent, kind, loving, always learning new things and she loved to laugh. Most of all she loved her husband Junior, and they watched closely after one another. She leaves to cherish her precious memory: her wonderful husband, Hilbert Hebron; one brother, Howard J. Johnson; one sister, Paulette C. Clarke; two sisters-in-law, Arlene Warren and Deborah L. Johnson; one brother-in-law, Edward M.
