CLARENCE LEE JONES, SR. was born on February 22, 1924 in Scotland Neck, North Carolina, to the late John Thomas Jones and Betsy Lee Clark Jones. He departed this life on November 20, 2010. He is preceded in death by one brother, Henry Jones and on sister, Rebecca Hopkins.

Clarence or “Lee”, as he was affectionately known by the Clark family who raised him after his parents’ early death, received his education in the North Carolina Public School System. He served in the Army in WW11 as a Private First Class in the 4514th Quartermaster Service Company. He entered the service in January of 1943 and served in Asian Pacific. For his service he received the American Theater Service Medal, Asiatic Pacific Service Medical, Good conduct Medal and the World War 2 Victory Medal. Upon completion of his military service he moved to Baltimore, Maryland. In order to further his career he completed Technical Trade School studying electronics.

In April 1946, he married Mary Alice Boddie, and from this union seven children were born- six girls and one boy. Family was Clarence’s greatest joy and he truly enjoyed spending time with them. He often packed the family into the station wagon and took long scenic drives to visit other relatives or just enjoy nature. Clarence was employed by Westinghouse Corporation, where he worked for 33years and retired in March of 1986 as an electronic technician
