



Clarence W. Blount

April 20, 1921 - April 12, 2003

Clarence W. Blount was born April 20, 1921 in South Creek, North Carolina to the late Lottie Tillery Blount and late Charles Johnson Blount, Sr. He was the third of four children born to this union, all preceded him in death. He was called to rest at 1:30 p.m. on April 12, 2003 at Kernan Hospital. Clarence will always be remembered for his accomplishments as an educator and as a senior legislator in the Maryland General Assembly. His was a career that remains notable not only for the length of his tenure but also the breadth of his accomplishments. He achieved greatness under life circumstances that have served to stop others dead in their tracks; it was those very same adversities that compelled him to work so diligently on behalf of generations of constituents in some of Baltimore City's poorest neighborhoods. His mother died when he was five. Shortly thereafter his father moved all of the children to Caneeda, North Carolina to live with an Aunt and Uncle, the late Martha Vines and Rev. Theodore Vines, a cotton farmer. They stayed there for three or four years. Dad returned to Rocky Mount to seek employment. During those years, Clarence attended school sporadically and played and romped barefoot through farmland during a period when he should have been in school. During the depression, the family moved to Baltimore. Clarence got his first pair of shoes and he always said, "I wanted to wear them to bed". In Baltimore, the family shared a home at 411 N. Carey Street (since razed for super highway I-70 which was never built) living on the second floor. Now, nearly nine years old, Clarence was out of overalls, into shoes and finally

about to enter the first grade. Clarence attended Baltimore City Public School and graduating from Douglass High School in June 1942. He enrolled in Morgan State College and his collegiate education was interrupted after one month by being drafted in the United States Army. He served honorably for four years and received a Battlefield Commission and numerous awards and commendations. After World War II ended he returned to Morgan State College to continue his education and graduated Magna Cum Laude in June 1950. He was president of his class. In 1965, he received the Master's in Liberal Arts Degree from Johns Hopkins University. He also completed four years of graduate study in International Law and International Relations at Georgetown University, Washington, D.C. He as received numerous honorary degrees from various institutions of higher learning. He was employed by the Baltimore City School System and served for 24 years as Teacher, Department Head, Vice Principal, and Principal. During those years, he inspired hundreds of youngsters to achieve beyond their wildest dream. In 1973, he became college professor and Department Head of Social Sciences at the Community College of Baltimore, Liberty Heights Campus rising to the position of Executive Assistant to the President. In 1968, he made an unsuccessful run for the City Council of Baltimore. In 1970, he ran and was elected State Senator for the 5th Legislative District of Baltimore City. His achievements as a Senator are really too numerous to attempt to list in this document. His actions as a State Legislator, has touched the lives of citizens throughout the State of Maryland. Not many legislative accomplishments, during his 32 year tenure, have been realized without his guidance and input. He rose from a back row seat of a new Senator to a front row seat as Majority Leader and Chairman of a standing committee. He was an active member of The Prince Hall Masons, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, and Gamma Boule' (Talented Tenth). While on furlough, from the military, he married Jeanette Quarles. From this union one son, Michael Cedric Blount was born. In June 1966, he married Edith Gordine Chisholm. He is survived by his loving wife, Gordine, one son, Michael and one step-son, Mark Chisholm, one nephew,

Roy E. Owens, Jr., one cousin, Hannah Tillery, six grandchildren, and two great grandchildren and many other relatives. One stepson, Oswald "Chipper" Chisholm, preceded him in death.

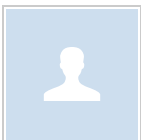

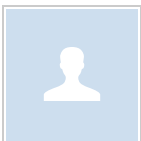

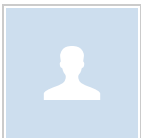
