CLARETHA HANNAH MARTIN, daughter of the late Roosevelt Sr. and Creola Shields Hannah, departed this life on Sunday, October 3, 2010. She was born in Sumter County, South Carolina on November 15, 1923 where she attended school and was raised to be a Christian.

Claretha later moved to Washington, D.C. in the later 1940's and worked various jobs throughout the city. In the early 1960's she moved to New York City to assist her brother Roosevelt to raise her nephew: Roosevelt 2nd , Ernest, Joel, Bruce and Timmy. Claretha later returned to Washington, D.C.

Due to her health, Claretha move to Baltimore, Maryland to live with her niece Mary Pack, her caregiver. In 2008 she became a resident of Future Care Nursing Home of Randallstown.

She was preceded in death by three brothers, James, John and Roosevelt Jr.
