Claudia “Kitty” Macelene Scott was born September 12, 1951 in Farmville, Virginia, to the late Whitfield and Bobbie Jackson Scott. She was also the granddaughter of the late Samuel and Rosa Bell Hall Jackson and the late Herbert and Mary Francis Scott.

Claudia grew up in the Abilene community in Charlotte County, Virginia. She was baptized at a young age and was a member of Triumph Baptist Church in Darlington Heights. Claudia also worshipped at Saint Douglas Baptist Church in Abilene.

Claudia attended Charlotte County Public Schools where she excelled academically. Shortly after graduating from Patrick Henry High School in 1969, Claudia moved to Washington, DC, where she embarked on her career path of accounting and business administration.
