CLAUZELL RAYMOND BAILEY was the first born child of the late Hilda and Sylvester Bailey, born on April 23, 1939 in Meherrin, Virginia. On Tuesday, July 9, 2013, Clauzell was called from labor to reward after a lengthy illness at the Genesis Nursing facility.

Clauzell, affectionately known as “Jimmy,” was the oldest of his mother’s eleven children. He received his education in the public school system of Virginia. During his teen years, his curiosity compelled him to leave Meherrin.

Clauzell relocated to Maryland in his late teens, always ready for a new adventure. He became masterful at driving, a skill he learned from his late cousin, Clint Bailey. The two would traverse the highways and by-ways while marveling at God’s great creation along the way. He entered the workforce at an early age, but maintained employment at Gordon Mohr, Inc. where he was indeed treasured. His work ethic and dependability afforded his brothers and nephews employment opportunities with the company as well.

As a testament of his faith, Clauzell gave his life to Christ at an early age and was baptized at the Levi Baptist Church in Green Bay, Virginia. He remained a faithful member until his disabilities impacted his ability to attend regularly.

On March 5, 1965, Clauzell married the former Emma Gross and from this union one beautiful daughter, Antoinette was born. Along life's journey he rarely met a stranger which led him to informally adopt two young boys named Chris and McKinley.

God's grand creation held a special place in "Jimmy's" heart. His appreciation for nature showed every time he went fishing. He often came home empty handed, but full of sunshine and joy as he spent hours seeing the splendor of the fish, birds and other wild animals. He shared his enthusiasm about fishing with both family and friends. He shared the sport of fishing with anyone who asked and was always up for the ride. When no longer able to enjoy the sport, he gave away his rods to the younger generation to enjoy. In recent years, when he could no longer fish, he continued to share his passion with his great-nephew. The two would sit for hours watching Animal Planet, Planet Earth or National Geographic. Each enjoyed the company of the other, but they especially enjoyed sharing their passion for nature, while educating each other. A better two peas in a pod, you could not find!
